



Blessed Richard Rolle

Hermit & Confessor † 1349 29th September

Born around 1300 in Thornton, North Yorkshire, Richard quit his studies at Oxford, bemoaning the worldliness and endless disputations at the University. He chose instead to lead the life of a hermit, writing extensive works of spiritual direction, drawing from his mystical experiences. He has been called the first author of English literature, with many Medieval works long misattributed to him due to the widespread imitation of his writings. He spent his last years near the Cistercian nuns of Hampole, South Yorkshire, where he died of the Black Death in 1349 and was interred in a shrine built to facilitate pilgrimages.

Saint Edward the Confessor

King & Confessor † 1066 Feast: 13th October

Edward was the son of King Aethelred the Unready and Emma of Normandy. When his father died in 1016, the Danish King, Canute the Great, seized England, married Edward's mother and had himself crowned King, sending the 13-year-old Edward into exile in Normandy. During the 26 years of his exile, Edward developed a profound trust in God. He regained the throne in 1042 with the help of the powerful Anglo-Saxon Earl Godwin, who effectively ruled in his place at first while Edward focused on Church matters, such as appointing of bishops and the building of Westminster Abbey, England's first Romanesque Church. Though Edward's appointment of many of his Norman compatriots cost him the support of Godwin and his son Harold (Edward's shortlived heir), and may even have contributed to the Norman Conquest, he was universally recognised as the model of a Christian prince. The eighth and last sainted English King, he is also the only one who has been formally canonised and whose feast is celebrated liturgically in the Universal Church. In 1163, Saint Thomas of Canterbury (29th December) officiated at the translation of Saint Edward's relics to a shrine in the Abbey that he had built.
